Nature of support 2015/16
<p>Support given to pupils has included:</p> <p>Additional TA support in classrooms to assist with settling in, maths and English catch-up, emotional and social support, regular reading practice, spelling practice and additional basic maths skills (£27,000 contribution towards costs)</p> <p>Funding has also included the cost of trips and club attendance, school uniform and additional books to support learning (£1000 contribution to costs)</p> <p>Funding is provided towards the cost of Mathletics for additional mathematics support, and additional music lessons in school (£360 contribution towards costs)</p>

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2015/16
<p>We have focused on the following this year:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provision of emotional and social support through a range of additional activities, including SCUBA, 'Time to Talk' and 'Socially Speaking' groups, friendship groups and one-to-one support. • Basic English and maths skills to support progress in core subjects. • Catch-up (basic skills) through pre-teaching and post teaching to support children with gaps in their knowledge. • Widening experience to help pupils extend their vocabulary, and to develop a wider understanding of the world around them (music, arts, visits etc.).

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Each pupil's progress has been tracked half-termly and adjustments made throughout the year to meet individual need. This is recorded on provision maps or within the class teacher's planning documents.

Although some pupils are not yet at expected levels, almost all pupils have made expected progress throughout the year, with 10% making accelerated progress. Two children left the school during the year, and two more at the end of the year.
